Joseph F. Szymanski, age 77 of Conshohocken, died on Sunday, July 2, 2017. Joseph was born in Philadelphia on October 18, 1939 son of the late Eugene B. and Genevieve (Pinkos) Szymanski.

He was raised in the Germantown section of Philadelphia, where he attended Roxborough High School. Joe held various jobs including working for ITE (which became Gould) and bar-tending. After a stroke at age 50, Joe enjoyed fishing, crabbing, trips to the casino, watching his favorite television programs and following the Eagles and the Phillies. Joe spent the last 12 years of his life living with his sister Theresa in Conshohocken and being Uncle Joe to almost everyone.
